With her last game of 182 in the Singles event, Makayla Douglas, hailing from the state of Washington, took first place gold over her team mate from Miami, Florida's Melissa Perez's, shooting her lowest game of 134, lost her 19 pin lead from the first 11 games and garnered the silver.
